# **Group activities on the topic of languages**

Students should do these activities in groups.

#### Activity 1: Find someone who...

- Each students is given a copy of the enclosed handout.
- The goal is to find at lest ONE person that completes the criterium for each item on the list.
- Students circulate in the classroom and try to speak to as many mates as possible.
- They make short notes for sharing at the end of the lesson.

### Activity 2: Language study in Czechia and abroad

- Students work in groups of 4. The groups should be nationally mixed.
- Students go through the questions and try to discover similarities and differences in the respective systems.
- They can do this only in speaking or they can be asked to make a list of the similarities and differences.

1. Find someone who is bilingual (= can speak two languages as a native speaker).

(What languages?)

2. Find someone who has taken part in a language competition.

(What competition? How successful?)

3. Find someone who takes extra language lessons outside school.

(Why? How often? What language?)

4. Find someone who has read a book in English.

(What book? How difficult?)

5. Find someone who is in regular contact with a speaker(s) of a foreign language.

(Benefits?)

6. Find someone who has English as their most favourite subject at school.

(Why like it?)

7. Find someone who has taken / is going to take an international exam in English.

(Which exam? Nervous? Result?)

8. Find someone who considers studying languages at university one day.

(What language? Job?)

- 3. How many lessons per week do you have for language study at school?
- 4. Is it common to study languages outside school, in a course? Do you know anyone who does this?

- 7. Is there anything that could make the language learning more enjoyable for you?
- 8. Is it common that young people read books, listen to stuff and watch TV in English language?
- 9. Does your school organise trips abroad? If yes, have you taken part in them?
- 10. Which languages can you speak? Which languages do you study at school?
- 11. If you could start learning one more foreign language, which one would you choose? Why?
- 12. What do you think of your mother language? Do you like it? What is the most difficult to learn?
